⁴ Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. ⁵ Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. ⁶ Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. ⁷ And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Philippians 4



This passage from Philippians has come to my mind many times over the past few months. Coming to Central Church is such a joy. The drive to and from Central Church each day is breathtaking. It is wonderful to see the season change. I am enjoying becoming familiar with the area and spend a little time each week exploring. But my greatest joy has been the way in which all of you, here at Central Church have welcomed me and made me feel a part of your faith family. I rejoice that God has called me here to serve with such an amazing church and surrounding community! I also see this same joy in you as you all gather together. In your worship, fellowship, and ministry I witness the rejoicing in community that Paul calls the Philippian church to embrace in his letter from prison.

Paul's letter to the struggling church in Philippi urges the people to live a high calling. Paul implores them to live in joy, free from worry, fully reliant on God. That is a tall order for any church at any time, but especially for mainline protestant churches in America today, seeing a decline in membership and financial resources, and in the United Methodist Church with a drastic change in resources, leadership and structure with 25% of congregations leaving to form a new denomination. Yet Paul tells us how to live beyond the worry and stress—through prayer and lifting our needs to God, for God is near. Paul preaches in Acts 17 (verse 27-28) that God is very near to us. In God, "we live and move and have our being." That is why we rejoice always!

What wonderful ways we witness the nearness of God here at Central Church! From my first Sunday, I have been awestruck by the musical gifts lifted in praise to God in our worship together. There is so much joy Sunday mornings when people gather in the Welcome Room, Lounge, sanctuary and the hallways, visiting and laughing and sharing. The joy continues as adults gather in study, all ages gather for fellowship and food, and people move about their work of service—ushers, worship leaders, TV ministry, cafe hosts, counters, and our awesome staff. What cause for rejoicing! And I haven't touched on all the beauty that happens during the week!

Yet, like many churches, Central Church struggles with the financial resources to meet our needs. In order to be a fully inclusive community in our great location with our beautiful building full of ministry and worship, we need the generous giving of our church family.. Together, we can give of our financial resources, and just as important, our time, gifts, and skills, to follow where the Spirit leads and to offer compassion and love to the world.
